BY THE
GOVERNOR

TO THE PEOPLE OF KANSAS, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the contributions of American Indians have enhanced the freedom, prosperity, and greatness of American today; and

WHEREAS, American Indian veterans continue to serve in the armed forces of the United States with distinguished commitment and valor in defense of this country; and

WHEREAS, American Indian customs and traditions are to be respected and celebrated as part of a rich legacy throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, in honor of National American Indian Heritage Month, community celebrations as well as numerous cultural, artistic, educational and historical activities have been planned throughout the state; I encourage all citizens of Kansas to strive to learn more about the rich and diverse indigenous cultures of Kansas by visiting local historic sites, trails, museums and archives:
